

**ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO DISMISS
RESPONDENT EMBARQUE EL MILLON CORP.**

On March 13, 2008, the Bureau of Enforcement filed a motion to dismiss respondent Embarque El Millon Corp. on the grounds that respondent Estebaldo Garcia is no longer an employee of Embarque El Millon Corp. and Embarque El Millon Corp. is a separate company with no relation to companies operated by Estebaldo Garcia. No party has filed a reply to the motion and the time to reply to a motion has expired. 46 C.F.R. § 502.74. Good cause for the motion having been stated, it is hereby

ORDERED that the Motion to Dismiss Respondent Embarque El Millon Corp. be **GRANTED**. The claims against respondent Embarque El Millon Corp. are dismissed without prejudice.
